Police

The Area Board Community Safety forum will meet again on Friday 12th March and will meet monthly.

Notes from the meeting in February have been sent to the Parish Council rep for circulation.

Youth

Following work with the Rise Trust there are no current plans from the Area Board to provide additional sessions within Lyneham Area. Amy Dallimore is currently providing a range of activities and sessions through her MoD role. There is currently no Youth Forum in the parish – this might be something for the Parish council to consider in due course.

Chippenham Road area.

Greenfields extension :

Two planning conditions left to satisfy – drainage and decontamination.

A consultant has been on site to carry out decontamination testing. Report should be available mid March. Discharge of conditions should be with Wilts Council end of March. Hope to start work on site April .

Lyneham Village Hall

The BSPCBF has requested a \pounds 5000 grant from Wiltshire Council Royal Wootton Bassett & Cricklade Area Board.

Bradenstoke Solar Farm Community Benefit Fund

All community spaces within the parish have been given an additional \pounds 1000 grant towards their running costs. In addition, the Lyneham Scouts and Guides have both been granted \pounds 1000 towards their running costs.

Planning

The Gladman appeal has been lodged and responses need to be in by March 18th.

MoD /DIO Notice to quit for private tenants

Talks are ongoing but to date nothing positive has been able to be secured. There are complications with the setup at Lyneham with respect to utilities which currently makes the transfer of individual properties to a 3rd party unlikely. Annington Property Ltd has not yet been notified by MoD that the properties are to be handed back. We are encouraging our MPs to put pressure on MoD to withdraw the notice as there is insufficient private rental accommodation for the displaced tenants locally.
