LTP4 covers the period 2025-2038 and will set the direction for all transport in Wiltshire, including road safety, highway network management and enhancement, car parking, buses, rail, walking and wheeling, freight, electric vehicles and more. It will set out how the county's existing transport infrastructure will be improved in the coming years.

## **Climate update**


We've embarked on far-reaching climate initiatives and we're pleased to say the substantial progress we have made means we're on track to meet our 2030 carbon neutral pledge.


# Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND) families invited to online meeting

# Network Rail and GWR drop-in sessions for Westbury rail upgrades

Network Rail and Great Western Railway have been holding community drop-in sessions in November, to talk to residents about forthcoming railway upgrade work in the Westbury area, and there are more events taking place in December.

Work starts after the last train leaves the station on Christmas Eve and runs nonstop for four weeks until late January.

The work will be noisy for residents living closest to the railway station. Network Rail apologises for any disruption caused. This is essential maintenance work to ensure the continued safe and reliable running of the railway.
